TUDOR PROJECT

My Tudor Family

The aim of the project is to create an imaginary family living in Guildford during the reign Elizabeth I. The main content of the project will be covered during history lessons but you will also need to do some of your own research, consulting as many books as you can. You may also use other forms of evidence; including the internet, museums and looking at Tudor architecture in the local area. It is important to keep a list of all the books you use as you will be adding a bibliography at the end of the project. Higher marks will be awarded to those who do their own independent research and add more information, and extra topics. The work will be started during the history lesson on Friday and completed over the weekend. It will be handed in on Monday for marking. If you plan on adding extra pictures etc. just add a note to the work. Extra pages can be done at any time but all work must be completed by the Friday after half term.

The Family

Father
Brother(s) – aged between 7-14
Baby/toddler
At least one child who died at birth or as a child

Mother - may be father's 2nd wife
Sister(s) – may be any age
Yourself – may be a boy or girl

1. **Introduction** – Include the surname of the family, the date the project is set, the members of the family and how old they are, including any family who has died. Father's job. Where you live in Guildford and which church you go to. Family tree and a map of Guildford to show where you live.
2. **House** – Describe your house including how it was made, what the outside and inside looks like and the furniture you have. Include a picture. Extra- plan of the house and information about the garden
3. **Mother and baby** – Home life – what she does, clothes, marriage, how children are brought up, especially girls and babies.
4. **Brothers** and yourself if a boy – School life at Royal Grammar, home life and what you wear.
5. **Father** – Describe what he wears, job, hobbies, past life e.g. previous marriage, apprentice, has he always lived in Guildford, parents etc.
6. Glossary, front page (inside book), contents and bibliography

Extra topics – you may like to choose one or more of the following to add to you project

1. Food
2. Parish Church
3. Toys
4. Create a will that belonged to your grandfather
5. Queen Elizabeth visits Guildford (she did 4 times)
