COVID CASES

The number of COVID positive cases across the School have risen significantly this week. There are currently 17 children who are testing positive across the School. Kindergarten and Lower Prep are the only classes with no cases for now! Where we have had positive cases, we have informed the parents of the children in that class. Generally speaking, children are asymptomatic and have not been badly affected. If your child tests positive, please make sure you inform me via email immediately as NHS test and trace do not contact School on your behalf. Families who are regularly LFD testing have helped to highlight cases early on, which in turn can prevent spreading the virus across lots of children. We are trying to provide remote learning for all children who are off School. Please bear in mind that it takes time for teachers to set children up with online learning. Emailing a teacher at 8am does not necessarily mean that it will be possible to facilitate online learning that day. We have known throughout the periods of lockdown and isolation that the most difficult scenario for both the class and the teacher is having some children in the classroom and some children on Zoom. Please be patient with our wonderful teachers. Thank you for your continued support during the pandemic—hopefully an end will soon be in sight!

CAR PARK SAFETY

The path between the five bar gate and the science block is used by staff in the mornings to drive into School to park at the rear of the building. We try to ensure that staff avoid this between 8.00-8.20am. If your child goes to breakfast club or arrives after 8.20am, please ensure that you take them to the front door of the School rather than just letting them in through the gate.

CAR STICKERS

A number of years ago, the School used to provide stickers for parents to display in their cars to indicate that they were part of the School. This helped when monitoring parking. As we have had issues this academic year with our car park being used by non-Rydes Hill families, we are reintroducing the car stickers. We will send home two stickers per family. Please can you display these in the front, left hand side of your windscreen (where the tax disc would traditionally have been). If you require more stickers, please ask at the School Office.

PARTY PACKS

As we move back to more 'normal' times and children's parties become a more common occurrence, please remember that the FRHPS has packs of reusable party refreshment items (plates / cups / jugs etc) that can be borrowed for a small charge.

COLLECTION FROM SPORTS CLUBS

If your child attends sports clubs on Monday, Tuesday or Friday, they will always be dismissed from the small gate next to the tennis courts. Please can parents wait at this gate for their child. Thank you.

SISTER PATRICIA FUND

One of the FRHPS' goals is to help and nurture the School community. The financial burden placed upon our family during this pandemic has borne unprecedented hardship, for parents and children alike. With this in mind, the FRPHS set up the Sister Patricia Fund. The aim of the Fund is to help support any member of the Rydes Hill family who is struggling financially. The fund could be used to help with school uniform costs, school trips, or other expenses that the family are struggling with.



It does not relate to fees, and is completely separate from the bursary / other fee related funds or support currently being offered by the School. Applications for the fund should be made directly to me and will be entirely private and confidential. Funds would then be available to assist the family as needed.

Importantly, whilst the fund has been set up in the current pandemic, the hope and intention is that the Sister Patricia Fund will be long lasting, and should be used at any time, by any parent or member of our family suffering an unforeseen circumstance or that are in immediate need of support.

We know that we are in strange times, where the financial stability of a family can change incredibly quickly. As a School we are a family community and we help each other in times of difficulty. Please do not hesitate to speak to me about the fund if you need to.

Covid-19 testing guidance for children in Year 6 and below



Showing symptoms (this is day 0)

Keep the child at home & tell their early years/ primary setting.

Get a confirmatory PCR test. Call 119 or book a test online at www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test

Positive result



Day (1-10) self-isolation.

You can stop self-isolating at the start of day 6 if you get 2 negative rapid lateral flow test results on days 5 and 6 and do not have a temperature. Tests must be at least 24 hours apart. If either test is positive, wait 24 hours before testing again.

Anyone aged 5 years and over, who has been identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 and who is not legally required to self-isolate, is now strongly advised to take a rapid lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days (or until 10 days since their last contact with the person who tested positive if this is earlier).

If you are aged over 18 years and 6 months and are not fully vaccinated and you have been informed by NHS Test and Trace that you are a contact of a person who has had a positive test, you are legally required to stay at home and self-isolate

Under 5s that are close contacts are exempt from self-isolation and do not need to take part in daily rapid lateral flow testing.



Return to early years/primary setting if child is well

You should always record a lateral flow test result, whether positive or negative, via the Gov.uk website For more information visit surreycc.gov.uk/coronavirus



who receives a positive lateral flow test result should report their result on GOV.UK and must self-isolate immediately, but currently will not need to take a follow-up PCR test.

From 11th Jan, guidance states that primary school age children (year 6 and below) are not required to regularly test, unless they are a contact of a positive case. Anyone

Lateral flow tests generally shouldn't be used for children under 5 years. Do not use lateral flow tests on anyone displaying symptoms.

Negative result

Return to early years/primary setting if child is well (note: you should still make a decision as normal about whether your child is well enough to return)
