### **POSITIVE RESULTS**

Managing those in School as well as those at home (especially when we had no working internet) has been a challenge. The situation seems to be calming a little. However, please can parents remain vigilant and continue to test their child when there has been a positive case in the class or at home. Children who have tested positive have commonly had tummy ache / upset stomach, so this is another symptom to watch out for. ## **SENIOR SCHOOL FAIR**

Parents of children in Lower Prep, Middle Prep and Higher Prep have been invited to our Senior School Fair in School next Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> February. The Fair will start at 6.30pm and will run until 8pm. There are ten Senior Schools in attendance, all of whom are keen to meet parents and talk about what they have to offer our children.
