ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

Thank you to everyone (staff and pupils alike) who embraced the messages of Anti-Bullying Week and wore odd socks or funky tights to School on Tuesday. We have been learning to celebrate and embrace our differences rather than to see them as something to be ashamed of or mocked for. Please help to reinforce this important message with your children at home. We are so proud of our kind, caring children and their wonderful attitudes and behaviour.

OUR NUT POLICY

There are children at Rydes Hill who have nut allergies and so we need to ensure that these children are kept safe. Our policy is that we do not permit nuts to be brought into School. There are key times when this policy is tested and the Christmas Fair is one of these. Whilst we are very grateful for all the donations of chocolate we received for the tombola, quite a few did contain nuts or stated that they were not suitable for those with nut allergies. These will be removed and donated to a local food bank as we are not able to accept them in School. Packaging that states 'may contain nuts due to manufacturing processes' is acceptable for all children in our School and as such will be on the tombola at the Christmas Fair.

Please can all parents be mindful of our allergy sufferers and make sure that nuts are not in anything that is brought into School. If your child eats nuts at home (particularly something like peanut butter on toast for breakfast) please can you ensure that they wash their hands thoroughly before coming to School. Thank you for your support with this important issue.

CHRISTMAS COLOURS MUFTI DAY

This Monday, 19th November, is a Mufti (own clothes) Day in exchange for bottles for the tombola at the Christmas Fair. Children are encouraged to wear Christmas colours (red, green, silver, gold) or a Christmas jumper.

This week has been a busy week for PE with four Netball fixtures played over two days! The 'A' Team played two incredibly strong matches and dominated from the start, keeping possession of the ball for most of their games. Passing up court was fast and accurate and Maya D and Scarlett DG converted one goal after the other – both girls were awarded player of the match for each game! The 'A' Team won 1-5 against Holy Trinity and won 0-6 against Tormead.
