SUMMER UNIFORM

All children in Main School need to wear Summer Uniform from Wednesday 1st May. When we return after Easter, you may choose for your child to wear winter or summer uniform until 1st May. The Second Hand Uniform Shop is open each Friday from 8am to 9am if there are any items you need.

PE KIT

When we return to School after Easter, the children will be allowed to wear white trainer socks/ankle socks for PE in the Summer term.

It has been noted by both class teachers and the PE Department that an increasing number of children are coming to School without the correct PE kit. Several children regularly don't have trainers and it is not suitable or safe to wear school shoes for PE as there is no grip on the sole.

We have also noticed many Prep girls without skorts. Please be aware that the 'skins' are a tight layer designed to be worn under skorts in the cold weather and should not be worn in place of a skort i.e. like leggings. We have played in some Netball Matches recently with girls in incorrect kit and this is not acceptable.

Please could you check PE kits over the Easter holidays to ensure your child is returning for the Summer term with the correct kit for each lesson. There are items of PE kit in the Second Hand Uniform Shop if this is of interest.
