FINAL HALF TERM

MESSAGE FROM SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL

Surrey County Council have asked me to pass the following information on to parents:

- All adults and secondary and college age students are encouraged to take a symptom-free LFD test twice a week. You will not need to isolate while waiting for the results of the symptom-free LFD test. Adults can collect a home testing kit from a designated site or order online.
- Please remember if your child or a household member develops COVID-19 symptoms, do not use symptom-free LFD testing. Instead, book a PCR test or call 119.
- Testing is not a replacement for infection prevention and control measures that education settings, pupils and their households must continue to follow. Remember: HANDS FACE SPACE FRESH AIR.
- We all need to continue to follow national and local COVID-19 guidance in line with the roadmap.
- If you're aged 30 or over you can get the COVID-19 vaccine (the eligible age is rapidly decreasing). You can book an appointment at a larger vaccination centre or pharmacy now, or wait to be invited to go to a local NHS service.

However, with the need to still keep bubbles separate, we have taken the decision to delay this until next year.
