Well-being Wednesday

In our Paws b Mindfulness lessons in Middle Prep and Form One recently, we have been looking at our amazing brain and how we can train our mind to help us be happier and notice some of the good things all around us. We have also been looking at beginning to train the mind in order to become more aware of our feelings and thoughts, which can affect the choices we make and recognising when there is an opportunity to make skillful choices. The next objective is to introduce our attention and how we might direct our attention and to understand that the untrained mind is fickle in nature like a puppy. We are learning simple tools for training the attention with attitudes of kindness, patience and repetition.

In Nursery Oaks and Kindergarten, we have now completed the first three lessons of the Mindfulness Dots course. The children have been engaged and happy to take part. We began by learning how to settle and find our own space and explore movement and stillness, and took part in a listening practice. We then experienced what it is like to direct our attention and introduced the concept of concentration and have now moved on to investigate our breathing. We have taken part in a number of fun activities so far.


