PREPARATORY SCHOOL & NURSERY

BAKE SALES

Bake Sales have now moved to Tuesdays. The next one will be on Tuesday 17th October and will be led by Upper Transition and Middle Preparatory. All children (and adults!) are invited to buy from the stall.

Bake Sales are scheduled throughout the year and are a way for each class to have a pot of money to spend on the 'nice to have' extras. These might include classroom board games, additional books for the class library, or more exotic additions – in the past, Kindergarten have used Bake Sale money to pay for caterpillars that hatch into butterflies and Upper Transition have used it for their chicks. Historically, the sales have raised in excess of £100 for each class, but we have been way off this total for a while.
