Thank you to everyone who supported the Reindeer Run before Christmas. Rydes Hill parents raised an amazing £1800 for Phyllis Tuckwell Hospice Care. The charity has to find £20,000 per day to ensure they are able to continue to provide their excellent care free of charge to the local community. This is challenging at the best of times, but with the reduction in fundraising activity and the closure of their 18 shops, this is increasingly difficult. Your support is greatly appreciated.

LATERAL FLOW DEVICE TESTING

The Government have provided School with rapid Lateral Flow Device (LFD) testing for all staff to begin this Monday 25th January. Staff will test twice a week at home. The tests are designed to find asymptomatic cases and are around 80% effective. They do not replace any of the existing measures in place, but are an additional strategy in the fight against the virus.








Form One Poems
