SENIOR SCHOOL OFFERS

We are so very proud of our Form One girls. In the past week they have begun to receive their offers. The process this year has been a little different, with dates and methods of assessment changing incredibly rapidly. The girls have coped admirably and the results they have achieved shows how hard they have worked and how well their teachers have prepared them. So far between them the 14 girls who have applied to Independent Schools have received 22 offers from 8 schools, with 7 scholarships. We are still waiting for results from a number of other schools, so we expect this total to rise!

REMOTE LEARNING FEEDBACK

Thank you to all the parents who completed our Remote Learning feedback. It has been wonderful to hear all the positive feedback and it has been a real boost for everyone. Generally speaking, I think we are getting things right (or as right as they can be in the current circumstances!). However, there are some tweaks to be made. One concern that came up from a number of parents was the intense screen time and the lack of a proper break in the middle of the day, especially with the pre-prep and prep children having different lunch times. From next week, lunchtime for all children will run from 12.15pm to 1.30pm. This should give adequate time for families to eat together and for children to have a break from the screen. In PE lessons, the children are given a routine of exercise that is meant to be repeated every day and could be something that is done at lunchtime.

Some comments have been made about homework. Most classes are setting spelling, times table and reading homework. This appears to be manageable for everyone and is an important routine to continue. Where other homework or finishing off is being set, this is now optional, and parents need to make the decision as to whether their child completes this or not.

The logistics of children getting from one Zoom lesson to another is proving a slight issue. With this in mind, teachers will try to finish their lessons five minutes early to allow time for children to get into the next Zoom room.

These changes may result in some timetable changes and, where this is the case, teachers will send parents an updated version as soon as it is ready.

Finally, we are at the point where staffing is incredibly stretched. We currently have one member of staff self-isolating as well as staff who are managing the illness of close family members. All staff are working full days, as well as trying to manage their own family issues at home. If there are times when a 1:1 reading session or a Zoom is missed by a teacher or teaching assistant, please bear in mind that we may not have the capacity to reschedule. We are doing all that we can and very much appreciate your patience and kindness.

There will be no achievement assembly next Friday, 5th February. Achievements will be celebrated on Monday, 8th February instead.

HALF-TERM AND INSET DAY
