FOOD WASTE


We are challenging all of our School community to reduce the amount of food that is scraped off their plates and into the bin each day. We have very little waste from the kitchen – the vast majority of what we prepare is served. However, there are on average 17kg of uneaten food that is thrown from children's plates each day. We have discussed this in assembly today and given children strategies for improving this. For example, eat all the food on your plate, or take a slightly smaller portion and if you are still hungry, go back and have a little more but try to eat what you take. Food costs have, in School as everywhere else, rocketed and we are avoiding passing that cost to parents for as long as we can. We will, therefore, work with our kitchen team to try to get the waste reduced. Our Eco Captains are on the case and will help support the children in making good choices.
