#### **WORLD BOOK DAY**

Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March is World Book Day. We haven't had a dressing-up day for a number of years so have decided to have one this year. All children, from Nursery to Form One, are invited to dress-up as a book character, using the following as a guide:

- 1. Costumes should ideally be clothes that you already have at home. Far better to spend money on an actual book than a costume. It doesn't have to be a full costume—a prop or hat would be just as good as a full costume. Prizes will be given for the most ingenious / simple but effective costumes.
- 2. Characters should be actual book characters, not characters from a film or TV programme.
- 3. Children should dress as a character from a book that they have recently read or are reading no Harry Potters in Nursery or Mr Men in Form One!
- 4. World Book Day is all about promoting reading and a love of books. If your character isn't instantly recognisable, that's not a bad thing it sparks a conversation about who that character is and why that book is worth reading.
- 5. World Book Day costumes should not be stressful for parents there are plenty of characters who wear ordinary, everyday clothes. Your child just needs to know who that character is, and be able to talk about them.
