REMOTE LEARNING

Hopefully the small changes made to class timetables have had a positive effect on everyone. We are now in the process of planning for the next half term. Teachers will have time on the Inset Day (12th February) to plan but we are, in the spirit of optimism, planning for remote learning in the first two weeks of term only. If classes have packs to be collected, these will be available on Saturday 20th February (further details to follow). In the event that the Government's plans change, and remote learning needs to continue beyond 8th March, teachers may require more time to prepare. If this is the case, live lessons will stop for two afternoons to enable them to have time to get the next phase of remote learning packs ready. We are hoping that this won't be the case and that we can have all children back in School.

Following the last lockdown, when we were able to have children back in the classroom, there was a period of time when some children remained at home and some returned to School. In all honesty, I think many teachers would say that this 'mixed classroom' was the most challenging of all. It is incredibly difficult to teach with the majority of the class in front of you and a few children at home. Whilst I completely understand the anxieties that parents may have about sending their children back to School, we will need to focus the live teaching on those in the classroom. Should parents choose not to send their child back to School when we re-open, learning will be provided via Showbie. There will be a timetable of Zooms so that the child can see their teacher and their classmates but it will not be the same as the current remote learning provision. When the time comes to return to School, any parents who have concerns are welcome to contact me to discuss these so that we can try to address them.

In assembly this Monday we talked about what makes a good teacher. It was lovely to see some of the responses that the children emailed in to share with me. Hairstyle and footwear featured highly! But it was also wonderful to see the qualities and attributes that the children value in their teachers. 








'Peace at Last' Story Maps with Lower Transition
