SCARLET FEVER / STREP A

There has been a great deal in the news about the strain of Group A Streptococcus, that has very sadly resulted in the death of some children. A ParentMail was sent out earlier in the week with information, and the flow chart from that ParentMail is also at the end of this newsletter. Please be vigilant for signs of this disease in your child. Scarlet Fever is common in children (we had two cases in Nursery before half term), and we will be working to maintain the hygiene habits we got into during the pandemic to try to ensure that any further cases we have are well managed.

WINTERY WEATHER

As the weather is colder, we have noticed more children are wearing additional items to keep warm. Please can children wear the Rydes Hill Beanie (available in the second hand shop and at Valentino) and a plain navy or green scarf to keep warm. Gloves should be plain and ideally navy or green. Whilst the hats, gloves, scarves and ear muffs children have been wearing are lovely and warm, they are not part of our uniform and need to be kept at home.

CAROLS AROUND THE CHRISTMAS TREE

One of the wonderful traditions we have at Rydes Hill is for the whole School to gather around the Christmas Tree on the last day of term and sing Carols. HOCKEY IN PREP PE LESSONS

Due to cold weather children would benefit from wearing their **school beanie** and **gloves with a grip**, these can be bought very cheaply (Decathlon).

When should you worry?



If your child has any of the following:

- · Becomes pale, mottled and feels abnormally cold to touch
- Is going blue around the lips
- Too breathless to talk / eat or drink
- Has a fit/seizure
- Becomes extremely agitated (crying inconsolably despite distraction), confused of very lethargic (difficult to wake)
- Develops a rash that does not disappear with pressure (the 'Glass Test')
- Is under 3 months of age with a temperature of 38°C / 100.4°F or above (unless fever in the 48 hours following vaccinations and no other red or amber features)

You need urgent help.

Go to the nearest Hospital Emergency (A&E) Department or phone 999



If your child has any of the following:

- · Is finding it hard to breathe
- · Unable to swallow saliva
- Seems dehydrated (sunken eyes, drowsy or not passed urine for 12 hours)
- Is becoming drowsy (excessively sleepy) or irritable (unable to settle them with toys, TV, food or picking up) - especially if they remain drowsy or irritable despite their fever coming down
- · Has extreme shivering or complains of muscle pain
- Develops a painful, red swollen gland in their neck which is increasing in size
- Is 3-6 months of age with a temperature of 39°C / 102.2°F or above (but fever is common in babies up to 2 days after they receive vaccinations)
- Continues to have a a fever of 38°C or above for more than 5 days
- If your child has recently had scarlet fever but now appears to have a puffy face/eyelids, tea 'coca-cola' coloured urine (pee), or a swollen, painful joint(s)
- Is getting worse or if you are worried

You need to contact a doctor or nurse today.
